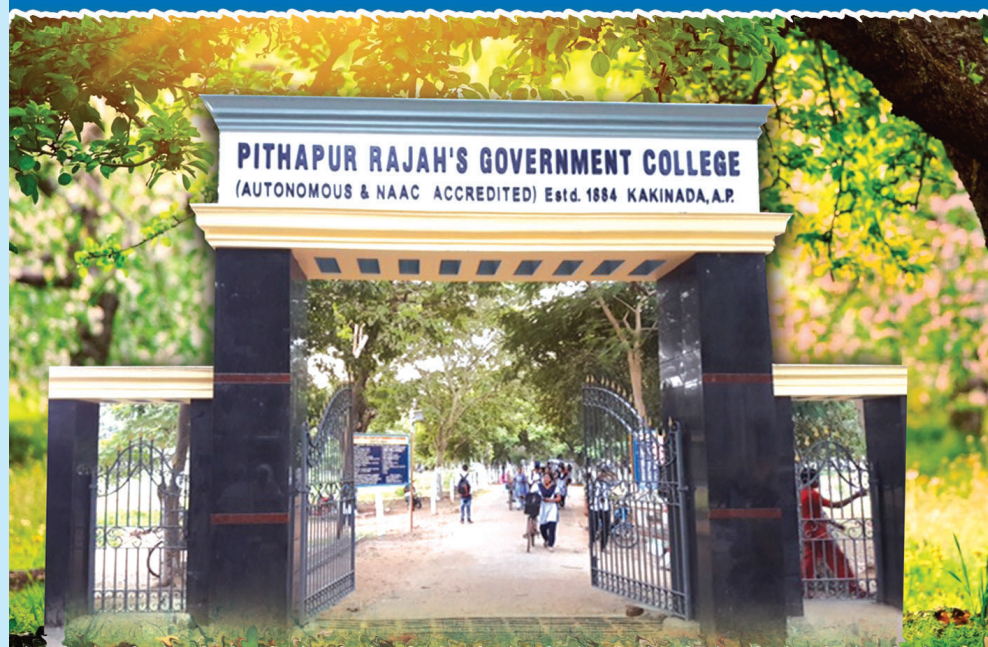

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## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Pithapur Rajah's College, Kakinada ranks among the earliest institutions of Higher Education in South India. It is located in East Godavri District of Andhra Pradesh. P.R.College was established in August, 1884 by Sri Rajah Rao Venkata Mahipathi, Gangadhara Rama Rao, Bahadur. First it was started as a middle school, and became a full fledged College. The present District Central Library, Super Bazar and DEO's Office were part of P.R College campus once.

P.R College has two campuses, Science College campus is near main road and Arts College Campus with sprawling grounds of nearly 28 acres is situated near Government General Hospital. McLaren High School is on the eastern side, District Collectors Office, Zillaparishad and C B M School are on the western side of P.R College. P.R College is the first college to encourage women's education with total exemption of fee for girl students. Girl students were given many incentives to pursue their higher education.

In 1952, when the college was taken over by the Government, it became P.R Govt. college. This century old college had its centenary celebrations in March, 1984. Considering the development of P.R Govt. College, UGC conferred autonomous status, with the concurrence of Andhra University and the approval of the Government of Andhra Pradesh. The college became autonomous with effect from the academic year 2000 –2001. Citizens of Kakinada town regard P.R.Govt. College as their precious possession. The College has been Identified for the status of CPE (College with Potential for Excellence) by the UGC during October 2010 and supported financially to fulfill the objectives of the scheme. NAAC Accredited with 'A' Grade in 2017.

### *The Autonomous Status*

The National Policy on Education in 1986 and 1992 have strongly underlined the need for conferring the status of autonomy on affiliated colleges. The University Grants Commission has since decided to confer Autonomous status on certain reputed colleges which have an excellent record of academic distinction and strong infrastructural facilities, Considering the alround growth and the infrastructural facilities in P.R.Govt. College the autonomous status was conferred on this College by the UGC, with the concurrence of Andhra University and approval of the Government of Andhra Pradesh. Thus the College has become autonomous, with effect from the academic year 2000-2001 and henceforth this premier institution has come to be known as P.R. Government College (Autonomous), Kakinada, [G.O.M.S. No.85, Edn (C.E-1-2) Dept, Dt. 16-5-2000.] The autonomous status of the college has been extended by the UGC till 2021.

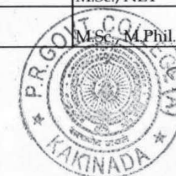

## AUTONOMOUS SYSTEM

The College was granted autonomous status by the UGC with the approval of University & Govt. of A.P. in May 2000 and extended upto 2014 by the UGC after making review of Autonomous system, Autonomous Committee re-visited the College and extended Autonomy upto 2021.

### AIM OF AUTONOMY

1. Autonomy is the lifeline of the institution that deals with education, creation of knowledge and learning of all kinds.
2. To Pursue truth fearlessly and build up in its teachers and students, habits of independent thinking and a spirit of inquiry unfettered by the limitations and prejudices of the near and the immediate which is so essential for the development of a free society.

### UGC GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETION OF A DEGREE PROGRAMME

A student who is not able to complete the programme within the normal period or the minimum duration prescribed for the programme maybe allowed 2 years period beyond the normal period to clear the backlog to be qualified for the degree. The general formula, therefore should be as follows:

- a) Time Span =  $N+2$  years for the completion of programme. where N stands for the normal or minimum duration prescribed for completion of the programme.
- b) In exceptional circumstance a further extension of one more year may be granted. The exceptional circumstances be spelt out clearly by the relevant statutory body concerned of the university.
- c) During the extended period the student shall be considered as a private candidate and also not be eligible for ranking.

### ATTENTION

**The Governing Body of the College with Commissioner of Collegiate Education, A.P. , Hyderabad as chairman has resolved the following for attendance of the students for effective functioning & to impart quality education.**

**Resolution : Resolved to implement condonation for attendance as follows for the students of the college who fall in shortage of attendance.**

1. 75% to 70% of attendance - Rs. 200/- Penalty
2. 70% to 65% of attendance - Rs. 300/- Penalty
3. 65% to 60% of attendance - Rs. 500/- Penalty

**4. Below 60% of attendance - No candidate is allowed to appear for semester end examinations & No Medical Certificate is allowed.**

A Student Shall be permitted to appear for the semester exams only if he/she secures not less than 75% of attendance in theory 90% in practicals of each semester. Condonation for shortage of attendance will be granted for a maximum of 15 days for 2 spells only within the entire programme. A student who is not eligible for such condonation shall repeat the course along with the subsequent batch.

### Career Oriented Programmes

P.R. Govt. College (Autonomous) Kakinada has been identified as centre for offering skill oriented, value added Add-on courses to enable students to pursue the parallel degree while pursuing the conventional B.A./B.Com./B.Sc Degree in the institution. The prime objective of these courses is to equip candidates with career and market orientation enhancing their life skills with utility for job and self employment. Our college is one of the few institutions which has been conferred this rare distinction of offering their prestigious programme which will enable to earn double degree within a span of three years. ## ***Choice based credit system***

### ***Rules and Regulations for Undergraduate Programmes under***

#### ***Choice Based Credit System w.e.f. 2014 - 2015***

##### **Introduction:**

As per the recommendations of National Knowledge Commission and UGC as well as recommendations of High Power Committee constituted for the purpose at the national level, the central and state universities and other institutions of higher education need to carry out academic reforms. The UGC in its 11<sup>th</sup> Plan proposal and strategies has taken a number of new initiatives for reforms in higher education. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is one of the academic reforms and it has several unique features such as enhanced learning opportunities, ability to match students scholastic needs and aspirations, inter institution transferability of students, part completion of an academic programme in the institution of enrollment and part completion in a specialized (and recognized) institution, improvement in educational quality and excellence, flexibility for working students to complete programme over an extended time and standardization of comparability of educational programmes across country. This system enriches the learning ability of students thereby enhances Quality of education in the institution.

##### **The challenges of Globalization can be met by:**

1. Making the curriculum interdisciplinary.
2. Bridging the gap between professional and liberal education.
3. Promoting students' mobility – horizontal as well as vertical.
4. Collaboration with industry and research organizations/corporate sector units to foster innovations. It offers a flexible system of learning.
5. Learning goals of the course and learning objectives of the units/sub- units enunciated in the curriculum.

##### **The system permits student to: (ADVANTAGES)**

1. Learn at their own pace in some courses of study.
2. Choose electives from a wide range of courses – Knowledge and Skill based.
3. Undergo additional courses and acquire more than required number of credits.
4. Adopt an interdisciplinary approach in learning through electives & COP.
5. Inter college/University transfers of Credits.
6. Complete a part of programme in the parent institute and get enrolled in another institution for specialized courses offering in CBCS.
7. Enhance skill/employability by taking up project work, entrepreneurship and vocational training.
8. Make best use of the expertise of available faculty/resources of the institution.
9. Exposes the learner to community service, research orientation etc.,
10. Engages the student in various kinds of activities to enhance “learning opportunities”(group work, individual work, data collection, field work, quizzes, community involvement, project work etc.,).
11. Enables integration of concepts, theories, techniques and perspectives from interdisciplinary approach.
12. Capacity building of students through industry, academic institutions, research organizations and other private and public sector entrepreneurship, institutional collaborations.
13. Course components are delivered through Lecture sessions, Tutorial sessions, Practical/Practice sessions (LTP) of teaching-learning process.
14. A student enjoys an extraordinary benefit that his/her evaluation would be in terms of grades, computed through a more scientific and a logical process of normalization which imbibes the advantages of relative weighing of the performances against evaluating in an absolute way.

15. The great advantage is that the learning process is made continuous and evaluation process is not only made continuous but also made learner-centric and is designed to recognize the capability and talent of a student.

**Salient features of Choice Based Credit System:**

1. To ensure Quality in Autonomous colleges academic reforms in form of CBCS is operated /implemented to ensure:
  - a. Frequent curricular revisions.
  - b. Introductions of course credit system.
  - c. Enhancing reliance on internal assessment.
  - d. Encouraging research.
  - e. Reforming governance of institutions.
  - f. More emphasis on learner-centric approach.
  - g. To introduce latest knowledge in the curriculum.
2. A student will have to get enrolled at an Autonomous College for a Core course depending upon his/her requirement of a degree in the said discipline of study.
3. A student will have a choice of selecting General Elective from the other department from a pool of courses offered basing upon his/her interest. He /she will also have a choice of selecting Subject Elective course from the Departments of the respective programme in which the student is admitted. Further the student has to undergo the Compulsory courses offered in the Foundation Course (Compulsory core).
4. The departments of college will design and offer courses after the due consideration and approval by the Statutory bodies (BOS, AC & GB).
5. Each course shall be assigned with a specific number of Credits.
6. A Core course is the course which should compulsorily be studied by a Candidate as a subject Core requirement so as to get degree in a said discipline of study. Three courses each of Subject Core is compulsory and Subject Core Elective in III year shall be offered to each student by the departments.

**Types of Courses:** Courses in a programme will be of four components: (1) Language core (28 Credits), (2) Subject Core (92 Credits), (3) Foundation core (Compulsory – 8 Credits) and (4) Extra credits (1 to 3 Credits for each item offered).

**Language Core Course:** It consists of English as first language with practical component at the end of even semester having total credits of 16. One second language is to be selected among 03 offered and equal to a total of 12 Credits. Study of these two languages both in I and II years is compulsory for every student under CBCS.

**Subject Core Course:**

There will be a Core Course in every semester. This is the course which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement to complete the requirement of a degree in a said discipline of study. A course may be a soft core if there is a choice or an option for the candidate to choose from a pool of courses from the sister/allied disciplines which supports the main discipline. It may be called “Core Elective” or “Core Allied” In contrast, a Compulsory Course paper is called “Core compulsory”

**Elective Course:** Elective course is a course which can be chosen from a pool of papers. It may be:

- Supportive to the discipline of study
- Providing an expended scope
- Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain
- Nurturing candidate’s proficiency/skill.
- An elective may be “Generic Elective” focusing on those courses which add generic proficiency to the students.
- An elective be “Discipline centric” elective. It may be called “Subject Elective.”
- An elective paper may be chosen from an unrelated discipline. It may be called a “General Elective.”

**NOTE:**

- (1) Every student has to choose ‘one General Elective’ from an unrelated Discipline / subject with an intention to seek exposure to inter disciplinary Subject.
- (2) During V and VI semesters he/she has to choose one Subject Elective from each course of subject core along with project.

### Foundation Course (Compulsory):

The foundation course comprises of courses the based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement and the courses that are of value based and the man making education. Hence the courses offered under the foundation course component category are compulsory and spread over from I to IV semesters.

### Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment: (CCA)

Continuous and Comprehensive assessment is an integral part of CBCS. A continuous assessment system in semester system (also known as internal assessment/comprehensive assessment) is spread through the duration of course and is done by the teacher teaching the course. The assessment is done through various means including:

- Attendance
- Written tests
- MCQ based quizzes
- Presentations
- Projects
- Field visits
- Seminars
- Group discussions/activities etc.,
- Assignments, Viva-voce etc.,

### Grading:

Grading constitutes the core of CBCS, as it tries to reduce the subjective element in assessment/evaluation and there by prevents any disadvantage to the student. Grade is an index of the performance of a student in a particular course. It is the transformation of scaled marks secured by a student in a course. Grade point is the weightage allotted to each grade depending on the range of marks awarded in a course.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** The above table indicates that the Pass minimum Percentage is 40% the % of marks taken into considerations includes marks of Part I, II and III of each semester i.e., excluding extra credits. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) indicates the performance of a student in a given semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total numbers of credits assigned to the courses in a semester.

**Credit point for the paper** = No. of credits assigned for the course X Grade point secured for the course

**SGPA** = Total credit points earned in a semester / Total credits for that semester

### EVALUATION:

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts:

- **Continuous Evaluation (CE)**
- **End-Semester Evaluation (ESE)**

40% weight shall be given for Continuous Evaluation (CE). The remaining 60% weight shall be given for End-Semester Evaluation (ESE) for 1st Year Students. 40% weight shall be given for Continuous Evaluation (CE). The remaining 60% weight shall be given for End-Semester Evaluation (ESE).

### Continuous Evaluation (CE) :

Continuous Evaluation (CE) of a course shall be based on periodic written tests, other academic activities i.e., assignments, Seminars and Attendance.

**NOTE:**

**1. An average of 02 internal assessment examinations conducted centrally will be counted for 20 Marks.**

**II. Components of Continuous Evaluation for Practicals also.**

**End-Semester Evaluation (ESE):**

The End-Semester Evaluation in theory Courses is to be conducted with question papers set by external examiners. Answer papers will be bar coded to ensure confidentiality. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by external examiners on the basis of a well-defined scheme of evaluation. The evaluation shall be done immediately after the examination by holding valuation camps at the college preferably district-wise. End-semester Evaluation in practical Courses shall be conducted and evaluated by two examiners - one internal and the other external. The duration of both theory and practical examinations shall be decided by the Board of Studies concerned.

Appearance for Continuous Evaluation (CE) and End Semester Evaluation (ESE) are compulsory and no Grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she is absent for CE/ESE or both. A student shall be declared to have passed the examination in a Course if he/she obtains minimum D grade for the End Semester Evaluation (ESE).

**MONITORING SYSTEM:**

There shall be Department level and College level monitoring committees for the proper implementation of the proposed curriculum. The Department Council and College Council will respectively monitor Department level and College level implementation. College level monitoring will be done by a Committee presided by the Principal and will include the Chairpersons of Boards of Studies and Academic Coordinator and Controller of Examinations. Faculty-wise sub-committees may be constituted for effective implementation. There shall be monthly review at the Department level, quarterly review at the College level and Semester-wise review at the College level with COE. Department level review reports will be submitted for the consideration of College level committee and College level review report will be submitted for the consideration of College level committee with IQAC. The review reports from higher levels will be sent back to lower levels for implementation.

**REPEAL:**

The Regulations now in force in so far as they are applicable to Programmes offered by the College and to the extent they are inconsistent with these regulations are hereby repealed. In the case of any inconsistency between the existing regulations and these regulations relating to the Choice based Credit Semester System and Grading in their application to any Programme offered in a College, the latter shall prevail.

## BACHELOR OF VOCATIONAL PROGRAMME

The UGC has launched a scheme on Skills development based Higher Education as part of College education during XII plan leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B. Voc.) Degree with multiple exists under the NSQF. This will enable the graduates completing B. Voc to gain employment and before Entrepreneurs. UGC recently sanctioned new B.Voc. Courses i.e. 1) Horticulture 2) Pharma Chemistry 3) B.Voc. Commercial Aqua Culture and 4) Journalism & Mass Communication.

### Objectives of the Scheme:

1. To make higher education relevant to the learned and the community.
2. To integrate relevant skills in to the higher education system
3. To provide skill based education to students currently pursuing higher education but actually interest in entering the work force at the earliest opportunity.
4. To provide employable and certificate skills with necessary general education to Senior Secondary School pass-outs not willing to join existing higher education system.
5. To provide for up-gradation and certificate of traditional/acquired skills of the learners irrespective of their age.
6. To provide opportunity to move into higher education in future.
7. To offer bridge course to certificate holders of General/Vocational Education so as to bring them at par with NVEQF.

### Eligibility:

1. Intermediate passed out student with Chemistry as one of the 3 subjects.
2. NSQF level - 3 and 4 pass.

### ASSESSMENT:

1. Partner industries & NSDC will be given clear and well defined role in the assessment of the learners.
2. Practical hands on skills will be given comparatively more weightage in the over all assessment of the plan, as per the guidelines given by sector skill council.
3. Evaluation of Students will be on par with UGC Credit based Pattern.

Scope for higher studies:

On completion of Advanced Diploma (120 credits), a student is eligible for admission to level-7 (third year) leading to B. Voc Degree.

## **GENERAL RULES EXAMINATION HALL**

- 1) Students should carry their Identity Card into the examination hall (both during Mid Semester and Semester end Examinations).
- 2) Students are expected to be in their respective seats at the stroke of the first bell.
- 3) Students are expected to maintain pin-drop silence in the examination hall.
- 4) Students are strictly prohibited from any sort of malpractice in the Examination hall.
- 5) No students should carry Mobile Phone to the Examination Hall.
- 6) No student will be allowed into exam halls without college uniform (Except on Wednesday)

### **RULES OF ATTENDANCE**

#### **a) Theory**

- 1) Although an attendance of 75% is sufficient for being admitted to the Semester end examinations, the college insists on regular attendance at all classes. Therefore, no student should be absent from classes without valid reasons.
- 2) If a student is absent even for one period either in the morning session or in the afternoon session, he/she will lose half - a day's attendance.
- 3) If a student is absent for one period in the morning and another period in the afternoon of the same day, he/she loses the whole day's attendance.
- 4) Permission for representing the college in extra curricular activities like sports, games, cultural festivals NCC, NSS etc. should be obtained in advance from the principal with a letter of request, duly recommended by the teacher counselor concerned.
- 5) Names of the students falling short of attendance would be displayed on the notice board at the end of each month.

#### **b) Practicals**

The minimum attendance for practicals is 90% of the total practicals conducted during the academic year.

### **RULES OF THE LIBRARY**

- 1) All the students are expected to become registered members of the Library.
- 2) The borrowed books should be returned within 15 days as stamped on the due date slip.
- 3) An over due charge of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be collected from the defaulter.

- 4) Defaulters will not be allowed to borrow books unless they clear the over dues.
- 5) While borrowing library books, students are expected to check the condition of the books. If any damage is noticed, it must be reported at the issue counter immediately or else the borrower will be held responsible for any damage noticed at the time of return the books.
- 6) Journals will not be issued but can be read only in the reading room.
- 7) Presentation of the Identity Card is compulsory for using library, reference section & Reading room.
- 8) The books in the reference section must be handled with care.
- 9) The reference books are to be used only within the reference section.
- 10) The library will be kept open on all working days from **9.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.** with a lunch break of one hour from **2.00 p.m. to 3.00 p.m.**
- 11) All students must return their library books atleast for 15 days or before the even semester examinations. The student who fail to settle their library dues shall be dealt accordingly.

### **IDENTITY CARD & UNIFORM**

Every student will be provided with an Identity Card at the time of admission, which he/she must keep as long as he/she is a student of this college. Whenever he/she approaches the Office/Library/Departments on academic and administrative matters, he/she must produce his/her Identity Card. No request will be entertained without the production of the Identity Card. The Identity Card should also be brought for taking any examination, i.e. Internal Assessment and Theory or Practicals of semester end examinations along with the Hall Ticket.

### **FEE REGULATIONS**

1. Every student shall pay the whole fee each year if her/his name is on the rolls of the institutions.
2. Fees will be collected once at the beginning of the year. Tution fee Rs. 500/- per semester is compulsory.
3. Absence from the college with or without leave forms is no ground for exemption for the operation of this rule.
4. Fees once paid can not be refunded.
5. Names of the students who have not paid the whole amount due from them after the last day announced for payment are liable to be struck off the rolls. They shall be re-admitted, however after payment of fines and re-admission fee subjected to the availability of seat and other conditions.
6. If a student is once admitted & take T.C. in the middle of the academic year, he/she has to pay the entire fee specified for the year.

## ACADEMIC PLAN

As the college is Autonomous in nature it has adopted the semester system. The Academic year is divided into two semesters each consists of **90 instructional days**. The **odd semester** is from **June to October** and the **even semester** is from **November to March**. Each semester is a complete unit by itself. The instructional methods include conventional lecturers, classroom interactions, Mana TV programmes, guest lectures, seminars, field study etc. The syllabi & Model Question Papers will be provided by the respective departments.

## SEMESTER SYSTEM

Semester wise system of instruction and examination has been introduced in this college with effect from 2000-2001. All Students who joined in this autonomous college will be covered under rules & regulations of the systems.

The whole academic year is divided into two semesters. Syllabus has been framed semesterwise and instruction is imparted accordingly. Thus, for all the three years of Degree course put together, there will be six semesters. Final Examination is conducted at the end of each semester and it is called Semester End Examination. The marks obtained by a student in the entire course of study i.e. six semesters, will decide his/her passing class.

## REGULATIONS ON COLLEGE CAMPUS

1. ID Card must be worn by the students at all times while on campus.
2. The use of Cell Phones is strictly banned inside the classrooms and on the corridors.
3. Any kind of unruly behaviour, physical violence, harassment of women, and damage to college property will be dealt with very severely by the College.
4. Students are expected to be dressed neatly in formals or semi-formals that is appropriate for an educational institution. Any form of vulgarity, obscenity or dress with offensive wordings are strictly banned on campus.
5. Motorised Vehicles of students should be parked only at the allotted space near the main gate.

All examinations are conducted by the autonomous examination cell> Principal is the chief controller of examinations.

### Mid semester Examinations

- Students have to appear for 2 Mid examinations in each semester.
- Attendance for the mid examination is compulsory
- Mid examination marks considered for the 40% of marks of CCE (continuous comprehensive evaluation)
- Students have to follow the time lines for the better performance in the mid examinations.

### End semester Examinations

- Students have to appear for the external semester end examinations at the end of each semester.
- Semester end examination evaluation is external
- 40% marks in the pass minimum for the semester end examination
- Results of the semester end examinations will be denoted by grades.
- UGC 10 point grading scale is followed

#### QUALIFYING MARKS

A candidate shall be declared to have passed at the end of I/II/III/IV/V and VI semester if he/she obtains not less than **40% marks** in each subject in theory & practical separately.

### Practical Examinations

Practical study in the respective subject stretches throughout the semester. The practical methods include laboratory work, practical training, record work, field study, study tour etc., Syllabi, model question papers and practical schedule will be provided by the concerned departments.

- All eligible students have to register themselves for all the practical examinations along with theory examinations.
- Student has to put 90% attendance to appear for the semester end practical examinations.
- Maximum 50 Marks allotted for the semester end practical.
- Student has to submit certified record along with no dues certificate.



- For the purpose of semester end practical examination students will be divided into batches.
- Each batch has to take the examination on a specified date and time as per the Timetable.

#### Unfair practices in the Examinations- punishments

- College takes serious view on the unfair methods in all types of examinations i.e., mid, semester end and practical examinations.
- Cases of malpractices noticed at any stage are punishable.
- Nature of punishment will be decided by the Malpractice committee comprising of Controller of examinations and University nominees.

#### Examinations Appeals

##### Revaluation:

- A candidate may apply for the revaluation of any paper in any subject of his interest for the semester end theory examinations.
- Revaluation has to be applied with in the stipulated period after the announcement of the Semester end examinations
- Revaluation fee for each paper Rs. 350/-

##### Re totaling:

- A candidate may apply for re totaling of his marks in any subject of the semester end examinations with in the stipulated period .
- Re total Fee for each paper Rs. 150/-

## SCHOLARSHIPS

A good number of scholarships are awarded through Jnanabhoomi to the students every year.

In order that no brilliant student is prevented on grounds of poverty from pursuing his academic career the following schemes of scholarships for the award of merit scholarships were started by the Govt.of India and State Govt. in 1961-62 and they have been continued ever since.

#### a) Scholarships sanctioned by Social / Tribal Welfare departments.

The students belonging to schedule caste, Scheduled Tribes and listed Backward classes are granted scholarships by Social Welfare and Tribal Welfare Departments. The fees due from these students are reimbursed to the colleges and the students who are staying away from their homes are also sanctioned mess charges.

### Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Based on the recommendations of the NAAC, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was setup at P.R. Government College (Autonomous), Kakinada during 2004-2005.

The cell monitors the quality parameters in the college and ensures that the standards of excellence reflected in the vision and mission of the college are met and sustained. The IQAC aims to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.

### Student Placement Cell

The placement Cell acts as a platform that bridges the various companies at the national and global level and the students of the College. The Cell aids in organizing campus recruitment drives for part time and full time job offers across various sectors. It liaisons with the industry for internship opportunities for the students. In addition, counselling is offered with regard to placements and higher education abroad. It also offers leadership and training programmes whenever necessary.

### Right to Information Act, 2005

The Right to Information Act, 2005 (22 of 2005) has overnight turned the entire administration in India from Gram Panchayat to the Chief Secretary in to open-book. Anyone can seek any information from the public for no cost. The applicant need not disclose as to how he is interested in the information nor is he required to state the purpose for which the information is required or the purpose for which information so procured will be used. The information sought for shall be on the affairs of the State and shall not relate to the

matters of common knowledge.

The purpose and intendment of the Right to Information Act is clear. Knowledge being the strength, and a well informed and intelligent public opinion being the foundation for successful functioning of popular democracy. It is hoped that this act will also discipline all the voluntary movements aimed at streamlining the administration to the public good.

I am happy to introduce this well conceived legislation and request the readers to use the benefits under this Act to their best advantage.

### College Assembly

As a part of imparting and inculcating values in the students of the college and also implementing the directions of the CCE, as a best practice of the institution, assembly is conducted on every Saturday at 09.45 A.M. to 10.00 A.M. NCC cadets report before the assembly begins and starts with sardhan - vishram - savdhan followed by "Vandemataram & College song by girl students of the college. "Best saying or any quotation is read by 1 or 2 students. Important announcements etc will be informed by the staff and students. Assembly closes by National Anthem"

#### Objectives:

- 1) To inculcate value system and orientation towards the best practice
2. To note a roll call and turn out of students and staff
3. To inform the students & staff about important events, achievements, activities, duties to perform/follow & any other information with the permission of the Principal.

**Note:** Attending Assembly show the honesty & accountability and commitment towards the institution.

### Students Helpline Centre

It is established with the instruction of CCE during 2010 and located in Administrative building. It carries out the following functions

1. The students are issued bus passes on 8th of every month.
2. The college term fee and examination fee is collected by Bank Staff in the Helpline Centre.
3. Displays about Career Opportunities, information about higher studies, recruitment Drivves, & all other posters related to student welfare etc are displayed.

4. Information about admission's, fee particulars, & other related information regarding examinations etc are given to the students.
5. Sale of admission applications, examinations application, distribution of Marks memos etc are carried out the centre

### **SALIENT FEATURES OF RAGGING ACT**

The Attention of all the students is invited to the following salient features of Ragging Act notified by Govt. of A.P all the students should invariably furnish the signed undertaking that he is aware of the relevant instructions/regulations against ragging as well as punishments for ragging.

1. "Ragging means doing as act which causes or is likely to cause insult or annoyance of fear or apprehension or threat or intimidation or outrage of modesty or injury to a student.
2. Ragging is prohibited within or outside of Educational institution in the state.
3. Whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of the Educational institution such head or manager shall enquire into the same forthwith and if the complaint is prima facie found true, shall suspend the student or students complained against for such period as may be deemed necessary.
4. The decision of the head of the institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution is final.
5. Penalty for ragging.
  - a) Whoever with the intention of causing ragging or with the knowledge that he is likely by such act to cause ragging commits or abets ragging shall be punishable as per Andhra Pradesh prohibition of Ragging Act 1997 (Act 26 of 1997)
  - b) The students convicted of an offence under section 4 of Andhra Pradesh Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997 and punished with imprisonment for a term shall be dismissed from the educational institution.
  - c) The student convicted of an offence under section 4 of Andhra Pradesh Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997 and punished with imprisonment for a term of more than six months shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

- d) Any student dismissed from a college for ragging should be debarred from seeking admission in any other course of study in any college/university located in the state.
- e) In case of the students who involved in ragging, there shall be an embossment on his marks, cards and other academic certificates in bold letters which cannot be obliterated that he had indulged in ragging and had conducted himself in a manner unbecoming of a student.

6. Any boy or girl student should keep the identity card issued by the concerned educational institution in his/her possession and offer the same

for verification as and when demanded by any authority of the institution or hostel or any member of the staff of the institution or hostel who is authorised to verify the Identity of the concerned student.

7. No person who is not a student of the concerned educational institution shall be allowed to enter the premises of that educational institutions or its hostel without obtaining prior permission of the Principal of that institute, provided that the parents or the guardian of the students shall not be required to take such permission in writing.
8. Any student found to be indulging into any ragging activity shall be suspended immediately after communication is sent to him under the signature of the principal of the concerned educational institution stating that he is alleged of indulging into ragging activity. Such student shall be debarred from entering the campus of the educational institution or its hostel, except on any day at any time when he called upon by the authority of the school or by the Parents Committee for tendering explanation or for defending his case.
9. Ragging is cognizable offence. The same may be reported to the Police. However, the police should be called in or allowed entry in the campus at the instance of the head of the institution or the person in charge. The police also deal with such incidents when brought to its notice for action by keeping in mind that they are dealing with students, but not as criminals. The action of the Police should never be violent and always be guided by correctional attitude.
10. It is mandatory for the institution, where the incident of ragging is reported, to file a First Information Report (F.I.R) before the local Police

authorities such reports should also be made to the Civil Authorities and Higher Police authorities for taking necessary action in the matter.

**Punishments :-** Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
4. Withholding results
5. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
6. Cancellation of admission
7. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
8. Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 1 Lakhs.
