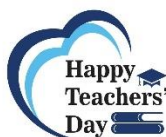

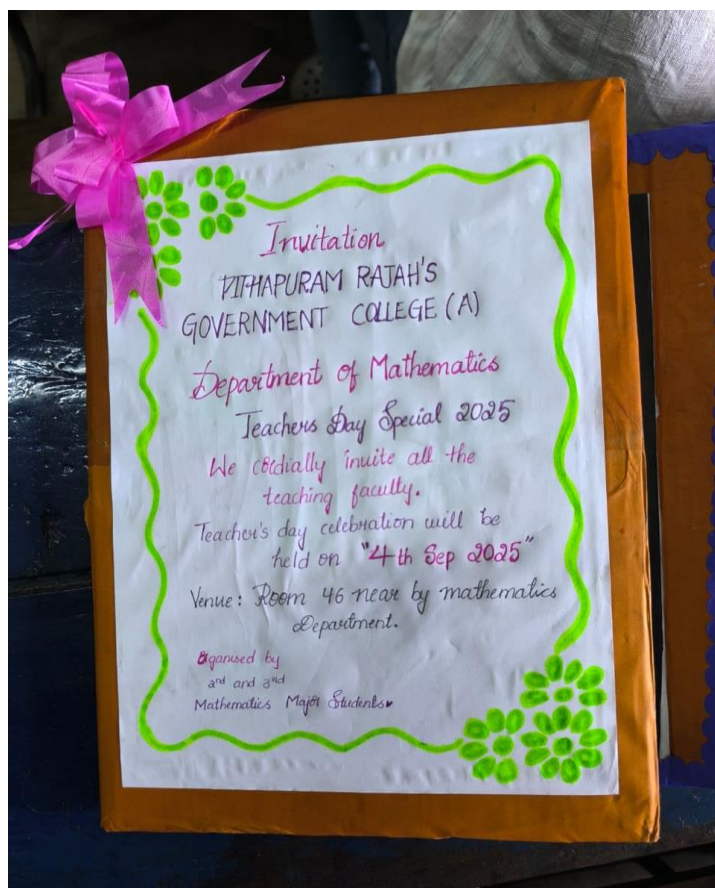
## Teachers' Day 2025: Significance

### **Outcomes of the Celebration**

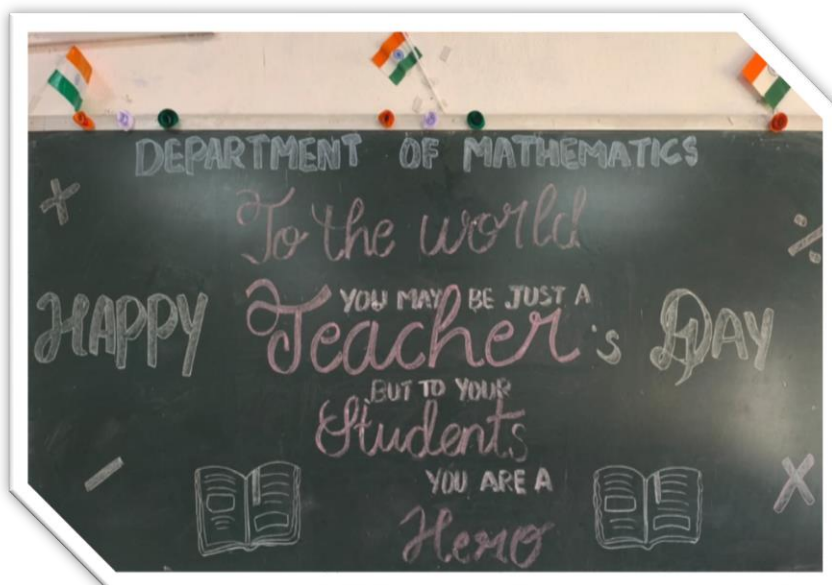
- Strengthened the bond between teachers and students.

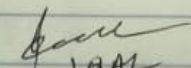
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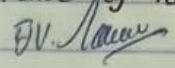
As a token of respect, students honored the principal, IQAC coordinator and all teachers with handmade greeting cards, flowers and mementos.

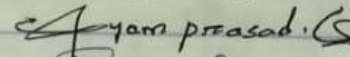
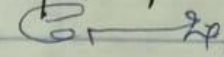
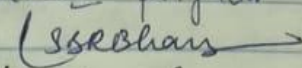
