Minutes of 21st Academic Council Meeting for the Academic year 2019-20 Held on 9th May, 2019

1. Approval of Academic regulations, syllabi, changes in Curriculum, pattern of question papers etc. as resolved in Boards of Studies meetings of various

Departments convened in April, 2019.

Discussion : Chairperson of Academic council explained the changes proposed by the respective Departments in BOS held for the year 2019-20. Sri B.

Ahmad Ali Baba, In charge Zoology Department, Sri V. Maqllikarjuna Sarma, In Charge Bio Chemistry Department& Nodal Office B.Voc Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Dr V. Anatha Lakshmi, IQAC Coordinator, Sri P V V Satyanarayana, In charge department of Political science, Smt P.Sara, Incharge Department of Botany participated in the discussion and explained the modifications made in the syllabi.

Resolution: Resolved to approve the changes made in the syllabi during BOS meetings listed in Annexure -I

2. Approval of the lists of paper setters and examiners recommended by the members of Boards of Studies in different subjects for the academic year 2019-20.

**Discussion:** Discussion done on the above and it is suggested that the QP setters may be selected based on the experience.

Resolution: The council approved the list of examiners submitted by the Departments in their BOS during 2019-20.

3. Introduction of Bachelor of Vocation Programmes w.e.f. 2019-20.

Two New B.Voc. programmes i.e. (B.Voc Horticulture, B.Voc. Pharmaceutical chemistry and one Extension ie. (B.Voc. Commercial Aqua Culture) the same were sanctioned by UGC, New Delhi vide file no.5-1/2018NSQF Dt.16/08/2018.w.e.f.2018-19. Prof A Matta Reddy University Nominee, Dr P Rama Mohana Rao Expert member of the Council expressed that the skill component to be imparted in the sanctioned Vocation Courses

Resolution: Resolved to approve the introduction & extension of the above new programmes w.e.f.2018-19 A.Y.

4. Adopting the B.Sc., Professional title to the B.Vocation programme with

internship for a semester.

Discussion: The Chairperson of the council informed that, as per the new MHRDC guidelines the existing B. Vocation programmes are to be renamed B Sc., Professional programmes with internship of 6 months. Accordingly it is proposed to rename the B. Vocational programme as B.Sc., Professional for the 2019-20 admitted batch after the necessary approval/ratification from the UGC and affiliation from the affiliating University as detailed below:

1. B Voc. Commercial Aquaculture : as BSc Professional Commercial Aquaculture

2. B .Voc. Horticulture:

as BSc Professional Horticulture

3. B.Voc. : Pharmaceutical chemistry as BSc Professional Pharmaceutical Chemistry. Prof A Matta Reddy, Prof K Ramneswari, University nominees are suggested that the vertical mobility, employability opportunities to be considered while renaming the B Vocation Courses, necessary communication to be made to the APSCHE & APPSC for the same.

Resolution: Resolved to approve the adoption of Change of Name of B.Voc course as B.Sc., Professional Course with the suggestion made by the University nominees subjected to the ratification from the IICC

5. Introduction of Embedded course in aquaculture technology form the academic year 2019-20.

Discussion: In charge Department of zoology submitted that to impart employability skills to the students the existing Market oriented, course B.Sc., Aqua culture technology ,Zoology and chemistry is modified as embedded course with industrial apprenticeship in fifth semester. Department of Zoology conducted Board of Studies for the same embedded course and proposed to start from 2019-20 academic year. As per the information from the Commissioner of Collegiate Education, National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB) informal agreed for providing financial assistance of Rs. 6000/during the apprentice period to the student.

Resolution: Resolved to approve the introduction of Embedded courses in aquaculture technology w.e.f.2019-20 A.Y

6. Proposal to start P.G. Courses i.e. M Sc (Botany) and MA Political Science from next academic year.

Discussion: Chairperson of the Academic Council informed that the departments of Botany and Political science came forward and got necessary resolutions in their BOS meetings to introduce PG Courses i.e. MSC Botany and MA Political Science. In charge of Departments of Political Science and Botany while participating in the discussion emphasized the need of the Post graduate course in their respective departments.

Resolution: Resolved to offer the proposed courses after obtaining necessary approval from the CCE, AP., Vijayawada and affiliation from the Adikavi Nannaya University.

7. To engage Guest faculty in vacant positions of different faculties of the college by utilizing available college funds.

Discussion: Chair person of the council explained the vacancy position of faculty and proposed for the appointment of Guest faculty against the sanctioned posts. Expert members Sri G Sunil Kanth and Dr R V Ramana Rao while participating in the discussion suggested that preference of Qualification like Ph.D., M.Phil., NET, may be given while engaging the guest faculty.

Discussion: The Chairperson informed that the Community service is one of the activities to be performed by an Autonomous college. Both faculty and students of an autonomous college have to extend their knowledge for the benefit of the neighborhood. In this context, it is put to the notice of the august body to take up extension/ outreach programs by different faculties of the college as a part of their regular duties by utilizing the allocation made in the UGC-Autonomous grant.

Resolution: Resolved to carry out the extension activities by the college apart from the NSS and NCC activities. Also resolved to expedite the feasibility for the award of extra credits and an appreciation certificate to students involved in community service from the next academic year on wards.

**Discussion:** The Chairperson informed that All the departments in their respective Board of Studies meetings (BOS) mapped the syllabus and questions with the specific course out comes and programme out comes. the time for the measurement of Cos & Pos with the performance of student in the examinations. It is proposed to procure the necessary software or hire the services for the evaluation of the Cos & Pos. University Nominee Prof. A. Matta Reddy & Prof K Ramaneswari participated in the discussion and suggested that while mapping the Cos & Pos care to be taken for proper mapping of the student performance.
