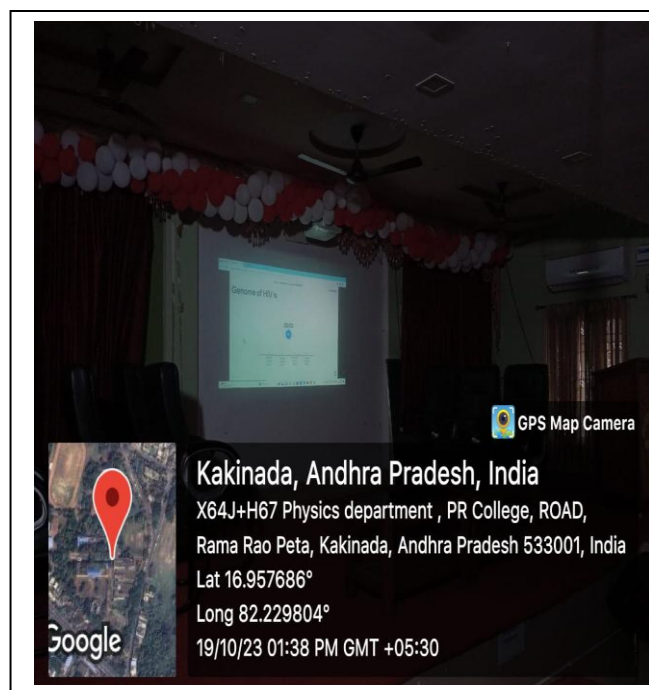
Brief Report:

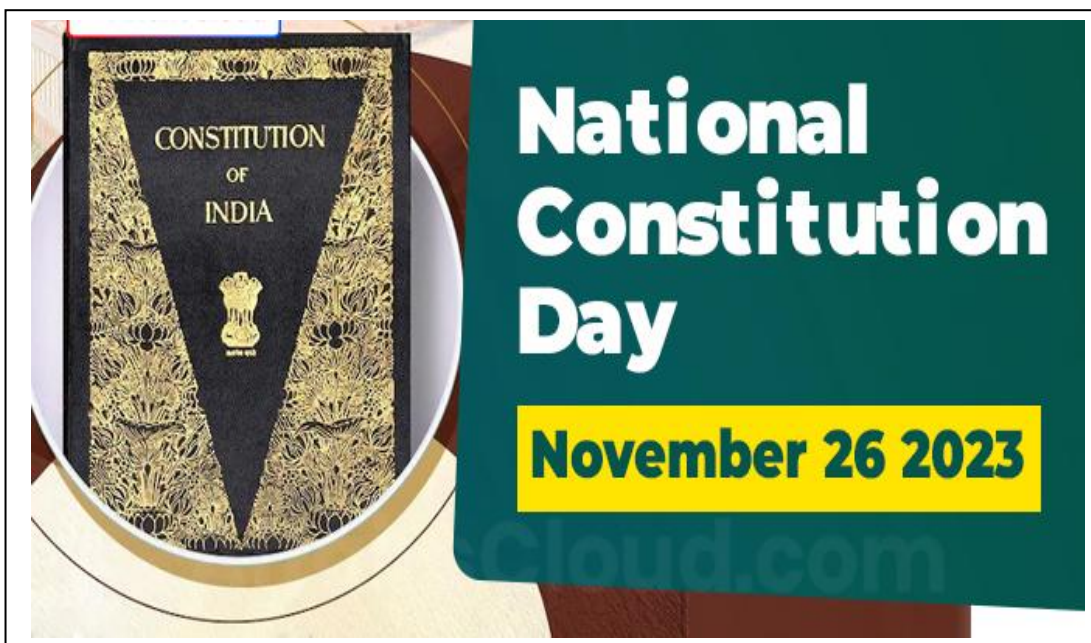
Brief Report:
